

The East Anglian Association of Anaesthetists Core Topics 2019 and Harold Youngman Prize Meeting will take place on Thursday 7th and Friday 8th November at Tattersalls conference facilities in Newmarket. The conference centre is in the heart of the Eastern region and has on site car parking facilities.

We hope that the meeting will prove attractive to all grades of anaesthetist. Thursday is reserved for lectures covering aspects of the Royal College of Anaesthetists Core Topics Matrix. On Friday, the morning session is assigned to trainee prize presentations – this provides an opportunity for trainees within the Eastern region to present research, audit, reviews and interesting cases to a friendly audience. In addition there will be an opportunity for trainee poster presentations. Prizes will be awarded to both the best oral and the best poster presentations. The afternoon session will feature further invited speakers covering Core Topics. There will also be a lunchtime workshop (limited number of places) on Friday. There will be a trade exhibition on both days. 5 RCoA CPD points are available per day.

Tattersalls conference facilities, The Avenue, Newmarket CB8 9AY

From South/London/M11

Exit Junction 9 of M11 onto A11. After 9 miles exit off (signed to Newmarket) onto A1304. Go through the village of Six Mile Bottom into Newmarket. Ignore first sign (to the right) for Tattersalls. Go down the hill and at 1st set of traffic lights go right into The Avenue. Approximately 100 yards on right is entrance into Tattersalls. Drive to top of hill (bending to the right) and park in front of white gates.

OR Head up on A1. Exit Junction 9 (Baldock, A505). Through Baldock and round Royston on bypass, staying on the A505. Go past the Duxford Air Museum, then after approximately 4 miles join onto A11. After 4 miles exit off (signed to Newmarket) onto A1304.

Go through the village of Six Mile Bottom into Newmarket. Ignore first sign (to the right) for Tattersalls. Go down the hill and at 1st set of traffic lights go right into The Avenue.

Approximately 100 yards on right is entrance into Tattersalls.

Drive to top of hill (bending to the right) and park in front of white gates.

From West/Cambridge/A14

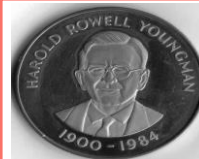
Take the A1304 exit after Cambridge (signed Burwell, Newmarket). 1st exit at top of slip road, and then move immediately into right lane. Stay on this road to Newmarket. Across the Racecourse Roundabout (rearing horse statue in middle) into Newmarket. Ignore first sign (to the right) for Tattersalls. Go down the hill and at 1st set of traffic lights go right into The Avenue. Approximately 100 yards on right is entrance into Tattersalls.

Drive to top of hill (bending to the right) and park in front of white gates.

From North/Bury St Edmunds/A14

Take 1st Newmarket exit off – through the village of Kentford. Stay on this road to Newmarket. At the Clock Tower go straight across, down the High Street. At 4th set of traffic lights, go left into The Avenue. Approximately 100 yards on right is entrance into Tattersalls.

Drive to top of hill (bending to the right) and park in front of white gates.
